HABITAT FOR HUMANITY BIG BUILD ROMANIA 3RD - 10TH OCTOBER



By now, you should all have heard about Habitat's Big Build project. A plane load of Northern Irish volunteers will travel to Beius in Romania on Saturday 3rd of October, and on Monday 5th will start to build 10 houses for Romanian families. On Friday 9th October, the 10 families will move into their newly completed homes.

Mrs Gorringe is one of the volunteers and has been encouraged by all your fundraising efforts. The class collection on Thursday 11th September raised the magnificent sum of over £400.

The class which raised the most funds was 8M, who brought in £79.

Mrs Gorringe also did a sponsored walk to work on Friday 18th October from Sprucefield to Hollywood via the Towpath. Thankfully, it was one of her days off, so no one was unduly worried when she didn't turn up for work at 8.30 as usual. She did, however get there in the end, and arrived just in time to see the students leave for the weekend. Luckily she now has time to recover before heading off on the Big Build.

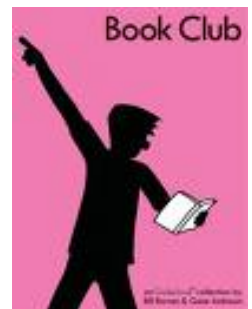

Printing In The Library



1. Please remember when you are printing out, to go to **PRINT** and select **CURRENT PAGE** to ensure that **only** the page you want is printed out. This is especially important when you are using publisher as extra pages you may not want will automatically print unless you select current page.
2. Please avoid using dark colours as a page fill because the elderly printer in the SEON room cannot cope with printing out dark colours.
3. Always ensure you are printing to the correct printer. In the SEON room it is HP 4600 .
4. If you are unsure about how your document will look in print check it out on print preview first.

Colour prints will cost you 15p per page.
