BUSY FIRST TERM IN THE LIBRARY!

Welcome to the first issue this school year of our LibraryMattersnewsletter!



A busy new school year began as usual with Library Inductions for Year 8 students. They were not the only ones introduced the workings of the Library; this year it was decided to set up a team of Pupil Librarians to assist with the day-to-day running of

the Library and to develop a variety of skills. Applications were made and a total of 19 pupils from Years 8-10 and 14 began their training in the use of 'Eclipse' library system and the organization of fiction and non-fiction on the shelves. After a month's probation, Librarian badges were presented and pupils are currently working towards their First Award Certificate.

Throughout the term displays were held to mark Roald Dahl Day (13th Sept); Banned Books Week (19th -23rd Sept); National Poetry

Day (4th Oct); World Mental Health Day (19th Oct); Libraries Week (8th-15th Oct); Hallowe'en; Lewis Festival (3-7th Nov); Non-Fiction Month (Nov) and NI Book Week (19th-26th Nov).

In the last few weeks of term Christmas came to the Library with lots of festive fun, displays and quizzes, Once again 'Secret Santa' proved very popular, with over 40 pupils taking a chance on choosing a wrapped book with only a

Almost as soon as the term began and Year 8 pupils had received their induction to the Library, STAR Reading Tests took place in the SEON Room. When all pupils had received their reading age and the range of books appropriate to them



explained, Accelerated Reader quizzing began in earnest. All quizzing is now able to take place in the Library as we have increased our I-pad stock. Uppermost in many minds was the coveted class trip to Barry's

in Portush in June, awarded to the class who read the most words throughout the year. 8G took an early lead while the top spot in Year continued to swither between 9C and 9S!

On Friday 30th November Miss Hopkins and Mr Peel were invited to attend the 2018 Renaissance Awards at AR HQ in Canary Wharf as we were shortlisted in the top 3 performing schools in Northern Ireland. Unfortunately we didn't win but enjoyed meeting the writer Andy Briggs and taking home some reading goodies!

December saw a new challenge when all pupils who achieved 100% in each of their quizzes were given a star on which they wrote their name and stuck up on our 'tree'! These were then entered into a draw at the end of term.

Royal Society Young Person's Award 2018

September saw our launch of our non-fiction book club open to Years 8-10 to participate in the search for the Young People's Book Prize 2018. This involved reading

and discussing six short-listed titles which featured a range of scientific areas and catered to children of varying ages. Our group consisted of 8 Year 10 girls who not only worked hard on choosing a winner but also enjoyed making a 3-minute video of the judging experience. Although it did not win, it was great fun and as well as a lot of insightful comments made about each title, it included some humorous scenes in which fine acting talent was evident!

At the panel's final meeting, 'Women in Science' by Rachel Ignotofsky got our top vote and we submitted this and our video and enjoyed

eating chocolate cake!

It was with great excitement a few weeks later that we received an invitation to attend the

finale event on Thursday 15th November at which the winner would be announced. This was held in W5 and as well as hearing from all the authors at the afternoon award ceremony, in the morning pupils were able to participate in a series of interactive workshops inspired by the shortlist. Although these were mainly targeted at primary school age children, our team involved themselves fully! The winning book was 'Optical Illusions' by Sarcone and Waeber which was our second choice! 
