Our Accelerated Reader Year



**AcceleratedTM

During the Autumn Term 2013, the Accelerated Reader scheme was introduced for all students in Year 8.

Accelerated Reader aims to motivate students of all ages and abilities to read more suitably challenging books, raise literacy standards and diagnose problems to help direct ongoing reading practice and develop a lifelong love of reading.

The 2013—2014 Library year turned out to be one during which millions of words were read and classes competed keenly for the ultimate prize of a day trip to Barry's Amusement Park in Portrush.

The class which read the most books and accurately passed the most Accelerated Reader Quizzes by

achieving 85% or higher was 8S. As you can see below, they had a glorious, fun day at the end of term to celebrate all their hard work!

Madeleine Inman and Matthew Jackson each read over 3 million words, Roisa O'Neill, Tony Cowen and Ronan Garrett each read over 2 million words and 28 other students were all word millionaires.

All our top readers were awarded prizes by Mr Peel at a special assembly which celebrated Sullivan school's love of reading.

During the 2014—2015 school year, all Year 8 and Year 9 classes are participating in the Accelerated Reading scheme, and already there are two students who have read over 2 million words! Which class will win the ultimate prize at the end of the year? Check up on progress by looking at the charts in the library.

HOW TO SUCCEED WITH ACCELERATED READER

1. Pick a book with the correct color dot on the spine for your reading level
2. Read your book within 2 weeks
3. Take an Accelerated Reader Quiz in the SEON Room as soon as possible after finishing your book
4. Get a result of 85% or more to stay on target
5. . . . and repeat.....and repeat.....and repeat.....


