


#### Ulster U21 Hockey success




## Youth International football representation

#### Fencing: N Ireland Junior Foil Series Round 6 and Series Round-Up

The 6<sup>th</sup> and final round of the 2018-2019 NI Junior Foil Series took place last Sunday 7 April at Hunterhouse College in South Belfast. Fifteen Sullivan fencers took part and between them set a new SU record of 11 medals won on the day: 2 gold, 3 silver and 6 bronze. And afterwards, when the series points totals were calculated, 8 Sullivan fencers emerged as championship trophy winners, including Victoria Morris who won a series 1<sup>st</sup> place trophy to become N Ireland U16 Girls Foil Champion.

#### U12 Girls

Year 8s Alexandra Ong and Sophia Cahill met in the U12G final in a repeat of the Round 5 final, with Alexandra again taking gold and Sophia silver. Both collected championship trophies, Sophia finishing the year in overall 2<sup>nd</sup> place and Alexandra in 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### U12 Boys

Oliver Playfair was the only SU entrant in the U12B category. Seeded 7<sup>th</sup> after the poule stage, he then proceeded to knock out the number 2 seed in a close run quarter-final, winning 10-9. Though beaten in his semi-final, Oliver came away with his 2<sup>nd</sup> bronze medal of the year.

#### U14 Girls

Year 8 Charlie Beimers and year 10 Alex Atkinson were SU representatives in the U14G age group. Charlie finished 7<sup>th</sup>, while Alex battled trough to the semi-finals, only to lose to the eventual winner 11-12 in a close fight that involved an extra time tie-break after the 2 fencers were tied at 11-11 at full time. However, the points gained by her bronze medal finish lifted Alex to 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the overall series standings, and the championship 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophy.

#### U14 Boys

Five SU fencers competed in this category: Alexander Penny, Arnav Arava, Finn Neely, Adam Caldwell and Keir Murray. Adam, Keir and Finn finished 5<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, while Alexander and Arnav met each other at the semi-final stage. Alex won this meeting 15-11 to go on to the final, Arnav taking bronze. Alexander lost the final 11-15 to take the silver medal, but the points gained from this 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish added just enough points to take him into the series overall 3<sup>rd</sup> place and the championship 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophy.

#### U16 Girls

The U16G event was an all-Sullivan affair, with SU fencers taking all 4 medals: Victoria Morris gold, Izzy Evans silver and Rachel McKillen and Angharad King the bronze medals. This was Victoria's 5<sup>th</sup> round win of the year, taking her into an unassailable series points lead and the U16 Girls Championship winner's trophy. Izzy's five 2<sup>nd</sup> places and Rachel's five 3<sup>rd</sup> places from across the year easily took them to the overall championship 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places and trophies. The overall series 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> places were also taken by SU fencers: Angharad King 4<sup>th</sup> and Ruzi Statham 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### U16 Boys

From the start of the 2018-19 year, Cormac Kitchen had been the lone SU representative in the U16B category. This time he finished 3<sup>rd</sup> to take his 4<sup>th</sup> bronze medal of the year, and enough series points to secure him the overall championship 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophy.













Conor Brannigan (12A) and Owen Brannigan (10W) participated in the recent European Brass Band Championships held at Montreux Switzerland (26-28 April), where they represented Northern Ireland as members of the 1st Old Boys Senior Silver Band.
