
Athletics Results from the Tailteann Games Schools' Interprovincials at Santry, Dublin

In April, 50 of our pupils in Years 8 and 9 were amongst the 270 000 pupils from schools across the UK who participated in the annual Junior Mathematics Challenge. The pupils who took part did very well with 8 being awarded gold certificates, 17 silver and 15 bronze. Nationally, the top 6% are awarded gold certificates, the next 13% silver and the next 21% bronze.

This year four of our pupils, Conor McKeown (Y9), Jack Wilson (Y9), Lucy Sloan (Y9) and Oliver

Duffield (Y8) were amongst the top 9200 participants who were invited to take a follow-on competition, the Junior Mathematical Olympiad or Kangaroo. The Olympiad is a prestigious event comprising of a two-hour long paper with a mixture of multiple choice and written answers and the Kangaroo is an hour long multiple choice paper. On 11 June, Conor sat the Olympiad and Jack, Lucy and Oliver took the Kangaroo. We look forward to hearing how they all got on early in the next school year.
