

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Keep reading over summer!





The middle of June brought to a close another successful yet very different year of *Accelerated Reading* quizzing. On our return to school in September all Year 8 & 9 classes completed STAR Tests giving them reading ages before getting stuck into quizzing. Thankfully, when lockdown returned in January, quizzing was able to be accessed from home and many pupils took advantage of this opportunity to continue their progress.

Quizzing during lockdown was steady but by no means as well utilized as if we had been quizzing weekly in Library class. However at the end of the year it is good to see that many pupils do continue to read and make progress. 247,205,858 words have been read by Year 8 and 9 this year with 4,439 quizzes passed. There were 50 pupils achieving millionaire status, 24 of those as multimillionaires. Top of Years were 8C who read 44,082,558 words and 9E who read 25,374,424 words.

Reading 2020-21




In Year 8 there were 23 million-

aires, 11 pupils reading over 2 million, 3 over 3 million, & 4 over 4 million. The top reader in the year was Liam Thomson with a magnificent 8,039,871 words.

In Year 9 there were 15 millionaires, 2 pupils over 2 million, 2 over 3 million, and Noah Currie and Lottie Burnside read over 5 million each, Lottie top of the year with 5.095.170 words.

Emphasis for all has been achieving 85% in quizzes and each month a draw takes places and a prize given for any pupil in each year who has managed this. Those who achieve



100% in 10 quizzes win a book. Many in the year groups managed to achieve this several times over, although two prize books were the limit!

Another difference this year meant that we could not have our annual presentation of certificates and prizes in the Drama Theatre to which all Year 8 and 9



pupils are invited. Instead only prizewinners attended the open air event on 18th June.



Bright sunshine accompanied this celebration of achievement as millionaires and multimillionaires received certificates, gold star badges and oth-



World Book Day 2021




Despite not being at school on World Book Day this year, we still celebrated it with much

entitled 'Sullivan Reads'. Award-winning YA author Sheena Wilkinson recorded a personalised creative writing workshop and there were class prizes for the most AR quizzes passed that week.

Once again the Autumn term saw a small group of keen readers take part in the Royal Society's competition to judge the Young Person's Science Book of the Year. Although we could not meet in person, our judges read the six titles and posted their comments on our Google Classroom. The group of Year 8 and 9 pupils enjoyed reading and reviewing the 6 shortlisted titles and selected 'In the Key of Code' by Aimee Lucido as their winner, a verse novel which combined poetry, music and coding as well as being a coming of age story and a celebration of girls in STEM.



CILIP Carnegie Award 20-21 Shadowing



In the Summer term when we returned to school a small group of 5 pupils (from Years 8, 9 &10) took part in the CILIP Carnegie Medal Shadowing Scheme. This involved




Summer Reading:
