The detectives started **Searching For Murder Clues** (Non-fiction 363.259) helped by the book **Molecules Of Murder** by John Emsley (Non-fiction 615.9).







participating schools) to find out which book had been most popular.





Why not give one of these a try?




BOOK CLUB REVIEW






