

by Miss Hopkins who read 'The Library Lion' by Michelle Knudsen, pupils did some activities together.




Readathon 2018

March saw our annual Readathon event take place. Carnegie Award Shadowing Group

The Carnegie Medal is awarded to the best children's novel and the Kate Greenaway Medal for the best picture book. A group of Year 8 and 9 pupils, calling themselves the 'Sullivan Shadowers' spent three months reading and meeting on Mondays to discuss the 8 short-listed titles Carnegie Award titles before voting for their favourite. Pupils were encouraged to post their reviews on the shadowing website. A live stream of the final was watched by some members of the group who were somewhat surprised to see the prize won by *Where the World Ends* by Geraldine McCaughren. Reading six books, they met each week to discuss the novels before voting for their favourite which was a close choice between 'The Goldfish Boy' by Lisa Thompson and 'The Hate U Give' by Angie Thomas, before settling on the latter to submit to the award. Pupils accompanied by Mrs Cinnamond attended the finale event in Campbell College where the winner was announced. Pupils enjoyed a visit from local author Kelly McCaughrain who read from her debut novel, 'Flying Tips for Flightless Birds' and we were joint winners of a book quiz! 





Annual Stock-take
